



Every single time you collapse your umbrella you must furl the fabric panels of the umbrella as you would with a hand held rain umbrella. Furling means to wrap the fabric around the frame. The procedure is necessary to prevent the fabric from being pinched by the arms as they close.

Once the fabric is furled, the umbrella canopy must then be secured with the strap provided. If the umbrella is closed and the fabric is not removed from between or behind the arms the fabric can get damaged wither by rubbing or pinching and this is not a warranty claim.

NOTE: Make sure there is no fabric caught between or behind the arms. If all fabric is not clear, damage to the canopy can occur. Any such damage is not covered by our warranty.



Pull all the fabric out from behind the arms and wrap or furl it carefully around the umbrella



Secure the umbrella with the strap provided.

To prevent damage to your umbrella you must do this every time the umbrella is collapsed. Failure to furl and secure the umbrella with the strap may result in damage to the canopy and any such damage is not covered by warranty.
