Hurricane Umbrella Range

Important; When you open the parasol, always make sure the canopy material is tight, so that the ribs/arms cannot move from side to side.

We recommend that all Bambrella[®] parasols are closed when not in use and always ensure that the parasols are tied or strapped in windy conditions. This is to protect both the parasol and people from damage or possible injury. If the parasol becomes wet open the canopy so it can completely dry prior to closing/storage.

Aluminium Parts

As a general rule the Bambrella[®] Hurricane range need very little maintenance. The whole parasol should be washed down periodically using soapy water to remove any dirt or other blemishes. Then rinse off with clean water to remove any residue.

Seaside/Pool Areas:

Bambrella Products that are used in these locations may require cleaning more often due to potential chloride deposits that can create both corrosion and etching.

Windy Conditions

Although our umbrellas have been tested to withstand use in windy (test) conditions, we recommend collapsing your umbrella when the wind picks up. **DAMAGED CAUSED BY WINDY CONDITIONS IS NOT COVERED UNDER WARRANTY.**

Bambrella[®] Parasol Canopies and Covers

The life of your parasol canopy can be increased by both using a protective cover when not in use and occasional maintenance. It is important that the cover is completely dry before using a Bambrella® protective cover.

Fabric life can be extended by simply washing down the cover periodically with warm soapy water using a sponge or soft brush to remove any dirt or other substance on which mildew may form. Spuncrylic covers are machine washable on a cold wash and can be washed up to six times without affecting the Teflon specialist coating. **DO NOT tumble dry, air dry only.**

Before storing at the end of the season make sure that the fabric is free from dirt and moisture to prevent surface deterioration.
